Services we provide

Along with routine appointments the practice offers the following services:

Family planning

All our GPs and the practice nurse offer a full range of family planning services.

Immunisations

The nursing team administers vaccines for both adult and child immunisations.

Cervical smear testing

For women aged 25 – 65. These tests are undertaken by the nursing team.

Chronic disease management

We hold a range of clinics to help our patients to manage their long-term medical problems including asthma, diabetes, hypertension, kidney disease and heart disease.

Other services

NHS Health checks for patients aged 40 to 74 years. We also offer the following clinics and checks: antenatal, baby, post-natal, mental health and counselling for drug and alcohol addiction

From time to time, other services may be available such as raising awareness of a particular disease or condition. We will advertise this information on our website and within the practice.

Home visits

Home visits are at the discretion of the GPs and are usually for those patients who are housebound or have significant health issues within our practice area. Should you require a home visit, please use the practice website to request one or contact reception requesting a call-back after logging a call before 10.00 am. A clinician will then telephone you to discuss your request.

Home visits are usually carried out between 12:30 pm and 1:30 pm, Monday to Friday.


